

## **Museum Visit Information for Adult Groups**

You are invited to bring your group or class to the Regina Plains Museum for guided learning activities connected to museum exhibits. Through discussions, activities and hands-on learning experiences, adult education programs are designed to interpret changing thematic exhibits by exploring how artifacts reflect the cultural, economic, political, and social development of the peoples of Regina. Older participants are invited to share their memories of past experiences associated with the artifacts on display. Teachers of Adult ESL or Literacy programs are welcome to contact the museum to arrange a program to suit specific learning objectives, or to find out more about the programs planned around specific exhibits (see page 2).

**Program Length:** variable (typically 1 hour)

**Group Size:** We can accommodate groups of up to 30 participants. Groups of more than 15 people will be divided in two, with two facilitators. ESL groups should be limited to 15 participants.

**Mobility Needs:** The Regina Plains Museum is wheelchair accessible, and able to accommodate people with walkers or other mobility needs. There is access via the back alley for vehicles to drop off passengers at the back door, not far from the elevator. Handicap parking is limited. Please enquire about parking in advance.

**ESL Learners:** The museum has an experienced ESL Educator on staff to provide appropriate language learning activities for groups at all levels. Teachers may make arrangements for programs aimed at specific functions or skills.

**Refreshments:** Refreshments for your group may be arranged upon request.

**Location:** The Regina Plains Museum is located in downtown Regina at 1835 Scarth Street, on the second floor. Directions for buses and a map are found on page 4. The museum is within walking distance of Regina City Hall, Victoria Park, and the Sports Hall of Fame. There is a wheelchair accessible elevator to the second floor.

**Booking:** To book your visit, call or Email the museum, indicating your preferred and alternate dates and times. Or, you may fax the Request Form, found on page 7. The museum educator will contact you to discuss specific needs and objectives, and your arrangements will be confirmed by fax.
